



Re-enroll for the 2021-2022 school year!

Wednesday, February 17th at 6pm we will hold Virtual Meetings for Parents about Course Selections. Zoom links will be sent through Plus Portal and are posted on the Master Calendar. MS Meeting will be for 6th & 7th grade parents and HS Meeting will be for current 8th grade through Juniors. Students will need to make their selections through Plus Portal and parents will need to approve from their account. We will also follow up on questions about the 21-22 SY Academic Plan and Calendar.

Re-Enrollment forms are found on the Parent Plus Portal Account, under the Forms tab. In order to ensure accuracy ONLY the PRIMARY Contact listed has access to the forms. If a parent does not have the form, please log in to the alternate parent account or call the front office. This is NOT under the student log in because a parent/guardian must complete all forms.

The re-enrollment form on your Plus Portal includes:

- 1. Updating demographic and contact information in our database.
- 2. Completing Required Medical Information (all students) Note: Current annual physical and medical history forms will be required for any students in PE, Athletics, Band, JROTC and Dance. The Physical/Medical History is not an online form.
- 3. Tuition Contract Agreement

All must be completed in order for your daughter(s) to be registered for next school year. If the student is not returning or your family is unsure, the parent/guardian must contact the Business Office in writing by March 31, 2021 in order to receive a refund for the Advance Registration that was paid with your current year's tuition.

We encourage all families to complete this form as soon as possible ONLINE. The form that you update in Plus Portal will integrate with our database to ensure we have the most update information for your daughter. You will not have access through the ParentPlus App. You must go through a Web Browser (Google

Chrome preferred).

Priority for course selection will be given to students who have completed all reenrollment forms. Academic counselors are visiting with students by grade level to go over course selection process beginning in February.

We anticipate questions regarding this process, so please do not hesitate to call our front office. We have several staff members who are able to assist you with any questions about how to access the online forms.

COVID-19 SAFETY


Covid-19 Testing is readily available.

Con Conrazon San Antonio is a program for Next Day testing results for faculty, staff and students for ANY school in Bexar County. The attached flyer here has more information or go to Con.CorazonSA.org.

We encourage any persons who may have been

exposed to Covid-19 to take advantage of testing availability. Any person who has tested and awaiting the results should remain AT HOME as a precaution until results are received. Results must be provided to the school by email edenoux@providencecatholicschool.net or text to the Covid phone line.

Any person who has come on campus must report if tested for Covid-19, experiencing symptoms or come in close contact with a positive case. Call 830-719-4711 to report any case after coming onto campus or attending a PCS activity. An individual's medical information is private and confidential. This phone line is designated specifically for Covid reports in order to expedite a communication response as efficiently as possible for the health and safety of all in our community.
